A new Eastern Star year has started. Worthy Grand Matron, Elizabeth Lashley, has a calendar full of events already in place for the year. You can learn more about those events by looking at the Calendar of Events in this issue.

Two topics will be covered in this article, with the hopes of explaining more about them, and they are Star-Lite District Reporters and Stellar Stars. Both of these are important parts for the STAR-LITE Magazine to be effective.

There is a Star-Lite District Reporter in each of the 21 Districts for Indiana Grand Chapter, with a support staff throughout the state as assistants. Nancy Pratt, as Editor, receives articles and proofs the results. Gail Bailey, as Director, places them in magazine form. Each edition then goes to the web person for publication on the Indiana Grand Chapter website. (indianaoes.org) The Star-Lite District Reporter no longer has to worry about writing subscriptions for our magazine. The last report received gave under 60 members with subscriptions paid and being mailed. This number will continue to dwindle. The Reporters can now place emphasis on attending District events, taking pictures, and writing short articles about those events. Give your Reporter a call. Advise them of the date and special event so they can plan to attend. When they are unable to attend an event, designate someone to collect the information, and then forward the info to your Reporter. They can submit, or help you submit to the Editor. Electronic transfer is the quickest and most efficient way for the Editor to receive the information, either as part of an email or as an attachment. Articles and photos should be e-mailed to Nancy Pratt, Editor. Chapter events and District events are news to Eastern Star members, probably more to members who now live outside a District or out of the state. It is our wish that STAR-LITE will continue to inform our members with the news of the state. Contact your District Reporter so that Your news appears in Your magazine, the STAR-LITE.

Stellar Stars has been a part of STAR-LITE Magazine for several years and serves as a means for members, groups, clubs and organizations to acknowledge, with a monetary donation, individuals or groups who have made extensive contributions to Indiana Eastern Star. There are 5 different levels of donation, from 1 star to 5 stars. Some speculation takes place as to how these funds are used or where the money goes. This year we want everyone to know your donations will be used to pay for the Grand Chapter website maintenance. This is not just an annual fee. There is operating time, putting the new documents on-line, updating existing information, and deleting data that becomes obsolete. This is completed through the Grand Secretary's Office because they oversee the printing of the issues still under subscription and operate the website. This year, Amy Ogrentz will be tracking the Stellar Stars donations. That means she will make the list and submit the grouping for Stellar Stars to appear in STAR-LITE. I am really excited about this and inspire each chapter to participate and make a page each month from your chapter for Star-Lite. Looking forward to a great year.

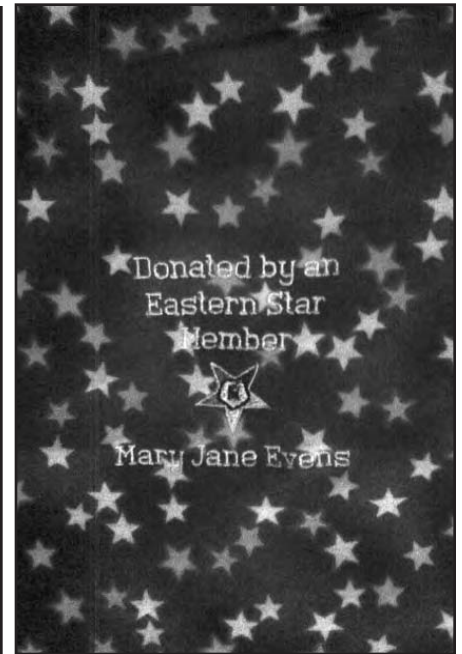

Community Service is Alive and Well in Indiana

This year the WGM has chosen to raise money for the Riley Hospital for Children with her “Karing Kangaroo” Project in hopes to provide car seats for the children leaving the hospital. Our WGP has gotten on board and have asked the members to donate Preemie items for Riley Hospital for Children. Even the subordinate chapters in Indiana have embraced the “Community Service” concept.

At Daleville Chapter #568 they had a yearlong project collecting monkeys for their police department and also contributed to the police dog fund.

I even had a “Community Service” Project fall into my lap. When my great nephew was diagnosed with Autism, it was not the news my family expected to receive. My niece, whose husband is in the Air Force and stationed in England, was in search of a “weighted blanket” prescribed by her doctor. She called my sister asking to find her one in the States, since they were quite expensive in England; my sister in turn called me to see if I could make one.



Well one thing lead to another and after making a “weighted blanket” and sending it to England, I was asked to make more for the children with Autism of military families. I reached out to my Sisters and Brothers in Eastern Star and suggested this as a “Community Service” Project to chapters that want to help. The response has been overwhelming. I had contacted the Most Worthy Grand Matron and she has encouraged me with this project. I had asked her if it would be permissible to place on the blankets the Eastern Star Emblem along with the member and or chapter that has donated toward this blanket. These blankets will then be sent to England to the U.S. Air Force Base Hospital where they will be distributed to those military families in need of a weighted blanket. She thought it was an awesome idea! What is a weighted blanket you may ask?

*According to OT (Occupational Therapy) Innovations, therapeutic use of weight is a common treatment option for both children and adults suffering from conditions such as autism, Sensory Processing Disorder (SPD), depression, anxiety and other types of mood disorders. In particular, those who suffer from SPD have a difficult time processing and reacting to the information coming in through the body's senses. Weight and deep pressure applied to muscles and joints provides a calming sensation, helping the central nervous system in processing and integrating tactile information and body awareness. Weighted blankets are often compared to swaddling an infant.

This blanket is on its way to England, courtesy of Sister Mary Jane Evens. Don't forget, the Royal Arch Masons have their RARA project that you can support through our Eastern Star. They are funding research on Autism and Central Auditory Processing Disorder.

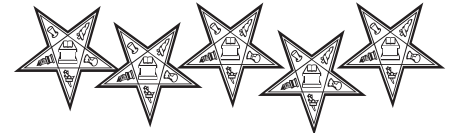
