Masonic History of the Indiana Masonic Home

This is part 3 of some of the history of our Masonic Home. Part 1 was in the January 2017 issue and Part 2 was in the April 2017 issue.

1916 – The first visit by delegates to the Masonic Home was made on a Friday morning. Four railroad coaches left the Union Station at 8:00 a.m. It was a very rainy day so boards were laid so the delegates might enter the buildings under construction – the main building for residents, the girls and boys cottages and the Eastern Star Hospital.

The Grand Matron was permitted to lay two green tiles in the hearth of the living room of the girl's cottage. With these beautiful words she dedicated the hearth. "May the beautiful lessons that the girls will learn, as they gather around this hearthstone, lead them to emulate the lives of the heroines of our Order. May they lead pure and upright lives, and thus become a credit to this beautiful home which our Order takes so much pride in preparing for them." (This is the building where the Grand Secretary's Office has been housed since the fire in 1973.)

1917 – The Cornerstone of the Masonic Home has been laid October 21, 1915. The first guests were admitted October 21, 1916. It was reported that 60 residents were living at the Home by April 1917. There were 34 Master Masons, 3 wives of Master Masons, 12 widows of Masons, 5 boys, 4 girls and 2 Eastern Stars. The 10 cents per member Home tax brought in \$3,483.70. Thursday morning nine railroad coaches of members made the trip to the Home over the Pennsylvania railroad.

1918 – A Liberty Bond of \$50.00 was purchased by the Past Grand Matrons and the Past Grand Patrons in the name of the Masonic Home. Friday morning a large delegation visited the Home.

1920 – A total of \$4,430.50 was raised for the Home by the 10 cents per member per capita tax. This reflects the large increase in membership.

1921 – The annual visit was made to the Home.

1922 – An orchestra of children from the Home provided music for the Past Grands banquet. Four hundred and five visited the Home Friday morning.

1923 – Forty-two boys and eighteen girls from the Home were brought to the Masonic Temple on Thursday evening and were the guests of the Grand Chapter for supper. The children presented a program at the annual reception in the evening. Three hundred visited the Home on Friday morning.

1924 - \$7,000.00 was voted for the Eastern Star Hospital at the Home.

1925 – Fletcher A. Boyd, Superintendent of the Masonic Home at Franklin, reported that there were 161 people and 184 children at the Home. Many gifts and money was given to the Masonic Home. In 1925 the banks that Sister Nettie Ransford had placed in chapters were still in use and a total of \$1,851.76 from them was reported.

1928 – Grand Master acknowledged Grand Chapter's influence in starting the Masonic Home. Also issued a warning against taking petitioners of advanced years – then admitting them to the Home. Three days after the constitution of Raleigh Chapter No. 508, the entire membership visited the Masonic Home.


1929 – Nettie Ransford died November 20, 1928. The WGM wrote an appeal to Chapters to celebrate Nettie Ransford's 90th birthday with as big a donation to the Masonic Home as possible.
