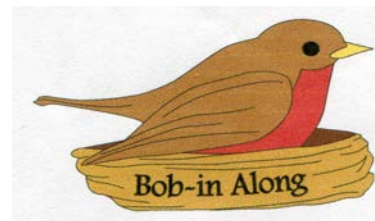

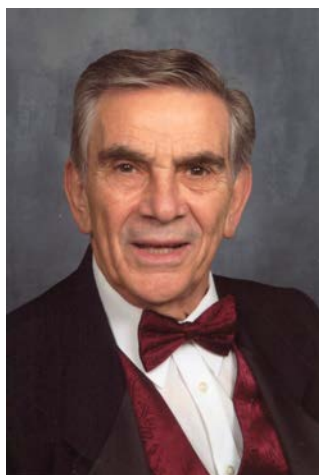

STOMP

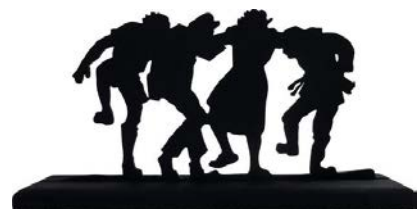

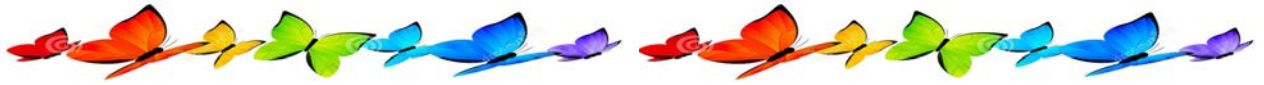
