Notes from Rick

Continuing with my membership develop program (R.E.S.T.) – We know that R stands for Recruit. Moving on to E – Engage.

Once we have people initiated, how do we keep them coming back? Think back to your own initiation – someone invariably got up and said, "You must come back; the more you put into it, the more you'll get out of it." Remember that? Unfortunately, that never encouraged anyone to come back.

We begin engaging - or we should begin engaging prospective members during the investigation process. beyond the form and ask prospective members what they enjoy doing in their spare time, what their hobbies are. Come right out and point blank ask them, "What do you see yourself doing for the chapter?" Take this information, pass it along, exploit it to its fullest and put your new members to work. GIVE THEM A JOB! Give them a job that fits with their own vision of how they can help. For example, we really don't need vouchers for our stated meetings, but you have a brand-new member who is "artsy" or "crafty," let them make vouchers, posters, signs, programs, etc. If you have an extroverted new member, let them make



phone calls to shut-ins to bring them news of the chapter. They can also make phone calls to check on members you haven't seen for a while and invite them back to chapter. When we give our new members a job, they will have taken ownership in the chapter. They will feel a sense of community and they will take pride in belonging to their chapter. Don't force your new members into an office when they are not ready for this responsibility, but give them something to do. Don't fall into the trap of "our memes are tired and we can't get anyone to do anything," when there could be newer members who are just waiting to be included. For example, I know of a chapter that had a member SEVENTEEN years who had NEVER been asked to take an office. What a waste of talent and energy.

Inspections are going great; we have seen some beautiful work. Thank you to all the chapters that agreed to have an early inspection. We have had some very "warm" welcomes at some of our inspections and receptions, but the friendly greetings, hugs, and smiles made everything worthwhile.

Brother Richard Lassiter, WGP, received his 50-year Award of Gold at the first inspection in the state at Englewood on July 17th. Our own Sister Madonna Meyerrose, PGM, was able to present the pin and Sister Sherry Johnson, GGCCM & PGM, was also at their side.






Hand-Made EASTERN STAR QUILT to be Raffled


