The Worthy Grand Patron, Harold Rowe and I have been kept busy traveling and attending luncheons and holding inspections within

various districts. We are having a great time visiting with our sisters and brothers. You have been so kind to us! You have opened your hearts to us and welcomed us into your chapter rooms. We are enjoying seeing you do your work.

One of my travels took me to Crown Hill Cemetery with Julie Snyder, Mountaineer #11, her husband Randy, along with Patty Pracht, and Betty Lou Hoover from Oakland Chapter. I wanted to visit Nettie Ransford's grave and take her some new flowers for the urn next to



her stone. I know Nettie Ransford Day would be approaching, and as Worthy Grand Matron I felt very strongly that I should go and pay respects to this great leader of our order. The more I read about Nettie and what she accomplished I wanted to go and honor her. As I stood there in the cemetery and read her stone, I did ask her to watch over Harold and me. I asked her for wisdom and guidance. To you that may seem ridiculous, but not to me. I am honored just to hold the same office that she held. I am in awe of a woman I have never met.





We removed limbs and twigs from her grave. Randy and I started preparing the urn for the new flowers when woman a us approached and asked what we were doing. Patty and Betty Lou explained who Nettie was and why we were there. She worked Crown Hill restoration. They clean off lichen the tombstones. She loaned us plastic scrapers and they started scraping it off as I worked on the

flowers. She promised that she and her crew would return the next day and use a safe chemical to spray on Nettie and William's stone and all the footstones. They also added Nettie's gravesite to their list of graves to maintain. Our meeting that woman was not an accident. God made that meeting happen. You had to have been there to have felt what remarkable things happened on that day, at that time and place, and with those sisters and brothers. We looked at each other in gratitude and wonder of what happened and the odds of that woman and her crew being in the same area where we were. Crown Hill Cemetery is 15 acres! We were supposed to be there at that time and meet that woman. Nobody can convince me that I am wrong. God made that happen.

The footstones are so intricate. One of the stones resembles a broken column. Bending over and scraping the lichen off, the stone looked like a tree sapling that was cut off with concrete leaves at the base of it. However, when I stood up and looked at it from the top, it was a broken column. Having served as a Past Grand Martha, to me that's what I saw. Was it possible so many years ago that Nettie Ransford bought that stone for their daughter's grave knowing full well the meaning of it, but the man that sold that stone or created it had no clue the significance of it? Nettie's husband was a member of the Royal Arch Masons. Together that husband and wife buried their daughter and placed upon the grave a remarkable stone shaped like a broken column.

Oakland Chapter is Nettie's home chapter now since Queen Esther chapter consolidated.

Over the years and through consolidations, Oakland Chapter has become Nettie's chapter. We left a few pennies for her in remembrance of her coin collecting and raising the money to start the Masonic Home. Nettie Ransford was a very strong and remarkable woman. Nettie fell down an elevator shaft and lived! She continued her duties as secretary while she was healing, but writing with her non-dominate hand. In reading about our 150 years of service Nettie Ransford nurtured this order and protected it as much as she could. I am truly blessed to hold the same office that she held, and I am determined to do my very best.

In closing, remember to be kind to everyone because you have no idea what they are enduring in their life.

Those of you who have been privileged to attend the events this year will no doubt agree that whenever she speaks, we are going to be impressed as well as entertained.

We have hit the ground running and are now in the full swing of the OES year. The receptions for our Grand Officers and District Deputies have been very good. We never know what to expect at these events but we always have a good time. The same can be said for our Inspections. The work that we have seen is very impressive. I'm sure that the members of our Grand Family will agree that we are always made to feel welcome in your Districts and so many of you have gone out of your way to make these events enjoyable. The Worthy Grand Matron has organized the calendar and the Inspections to make efficient use of your time as well as ours. It has been a real pleasure being able to participate in the Awards of Gold, the Baby Dedications and, of course, the appointments of the Voyageurs, our Grand Representatives. The addenda this year have been particularly fun and I think they put everyone at ease before the business of the evening. I have been privileged to attend several luncheons and have been treated to some excellent food, beautiful decorations and the impressive talks given by our Grand Star Points.

My Focus on Star section this month is on some of the more interesting facts about our history and Sister Nettie Ransford. When the Order was first organized, a beautiful name was given to the individual gathering of Stars: Constellations. In 1855, there were at least six constellations in Indiana, some with creative names like White Rose and Cassiopeia and some with place names like North Salem. Next were the Families, the first

of which was Plymouth Family No. 41. Then there were the Chapters and, of course, the oldest Chapter in Indiana is still operating: Sunbeam Chapter #1, possibly the oldest Eastern Chapter in the country. In the 1860s, Eastern Star "Lodges" were formed under the Grand Lodge of Adoptive Masonry for Indiana. The Supreme Grand Chapter was then formed in Michigan but eventually collapsed. In 1874, the Grand Chapter of Indiana was formed and in 1876, the General Grand Chapter was formed. Nettie Ransford would be elected as Most Worthy Grand Matron in 1890.

Nettie Ransford joined Eastern Star in 1872 and was Worthy Matron for the first time in 1874, the same year that the Grand Chapter was formed. In 1879, just five years later, she was Elected Worthy Grand Matron. She would go on to serve as Worthy Grand Matron two more times and attend every Grand Chapter session that followed during her lifetime. In 1889, she would serve as the first Most Worthy Grand Matron of the General Grand Chapter to have full executive power. She is most revered for her efforts to raise funds and establish the Indiana Masonic Home. In 1916 she was able to raise \$32,000 for the founding of the Home, equal to \$880,000 today. She was Grand Secretary from 1894 until her death in 1928. She held that position for 34 years despite several accidents including falling down an elevator shaft. It is said that she lived her long life through sheer iron will in order to see her 90th birthday.

This historical information is gathered from "The Eastern Star in Indiana" by Rev. Willis D. Engle, PGP, PMWGP, Woman of the Century by Frances Elizabeth Willard and an article of "The Eastern Star" by Laura A. Smith. More Eastern Star history can be found on the website as well as the many

Our mission is to enrich the lives of our elderly citizens living within our community by helping fill the gap between nursing home reimbursement and personal care needs and items that provide personal enjoyment for the residents living within these facilities.
